Didn't sign up for the member appreciation event because you're not a fan of networking? Or maybe you're a little out of practice after the pandemic? You're not alone! Identify common interests.

Consider how your goals align with those of people you meet, and networking will feel more authentic.



Think broadly about what you can give.

Remember that you have something valuable to offer, whether it's knowledge, gratitude, or recognition.



Find a higher purpose.

Frame your networking in terms of a larger goal—the collective benefits for your company, say—and the activity will feel more authentic and will lead to connections that bear fruit for everyone.
